THE PRESIDIO TRUST BOARD OF DIRECTORS

RESOLUTION 04-15 <u>AUTHORITY OF EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TO ESTABLISH</u> <u>PUBLIC USE LIMITS AND CLOSURES</u>

WHEREAS, the regulations at 36 C.F.R. 1001 ("Regulations") authorize the Presidio Trust Board of Directors to establish a schedule of visiting hours, to impose public use limits, to close all or a portion of the area of the Presidio administered by the Presidio Trust ("Area B") to all public use or to a specific use or activity, and to terminate a visiting restriction, public use limit or closure; and

WHEREAS, the Regulations require that the Board of Directors prepare a written determination setting forth the reasons the limit is necessary and an explanation of why less restrictive measures will not suffice, or in the case of the termination of a limit, a written determination of why the limit is no longer necessary and a finding that the termination will not adversely impact resources in Area B; and

WHEREAS, the Regulations authorize the Board of Directors to establish a permit, registration or reservation system to implement a public use limit; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable for the efficient administration of Area B to delegate authority to the Executive Director to establish a schedule of visiting hours, to impose public use limits, to close a portion of Area B, to terminate a restriction, limit or closure, and to establish a system to implement public use limits consistent with the Regulations;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Presidio Trust Board of Directors hereby authorizes the Executive Director to prepare the requisite written determination or finding justifying a visiting hour restriction, public use limit, closure, or termination of such restriction, limit or closure; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors hereby authorizes the Executive Director to establish a schedule of visiting hours, to impose a public use limit, to close a portion of Area B, to terminate such limits, and to establish a system to implement public use limits, providing such restriction, limit or closure is not of such a nature, magnitude or duration that it would result in a significant alteration in the public use pattern of Area B, adversely affect the natural, aesthetic, scenic or cultural values of Area B, require a long-term or significant modification in the resource management objectives of Area B, or is of a significantly controversial nature.
