<u>Item 6 – CEO Report, including a park report and report on recent law enforcement activities</u>

Ms. Fraser delivered the CEO report to the Board, including an update on the Trust's search for a new Chief Financial Officer. Mr. Boland then updated the Board on several park matters including the new reservation system for the Rob Hill Campgrounds, the opening plans for the new Battery Bluff and Tunnel Tops park areas, and the work on electrical substation 568. Mr. Genito provided an update on collaboration with the US Park Police to reduce smash and grabs from cars in the Presidio.

<u>Item 7 – Three-year collective bargaining agreement with Laborers International Union of North</u> America, Local 792

After discussion, and a motion duly made and seconded, the Board unanimously approved a three-year successor collective bargaining agreement with the Trust's union.

Mr. Pinto and Ms. Marshall then delivered a presentation on the current state of the transportation program, including extensive re-paving, the free PresidiGo shuttle, and converting streets to spaces for people to walk, roll and bike.
