Prefer indoor fun? The Presidio has it all. Bowl with friends at Presidio Bowl, climb at Movement Gym, or unwind with yoga or a rejuvenating visit to SenSpa. From adrenaline to relaxation, there's <u>recreation</u> for every season and every age.

Culture & Holiday Cheer

The Presidio's vibrant cultural scene shines brightly this season:

- The <u>Walt Disney Family Museum</u> celebrates 70 Years of Disneyland with the enchanting exhibit, *Happiest Place on Earth: The Disneyland Story*, on view through May 2026. Enjoy virtual and in-person talks throughout November and December and keep an eye out for a special visit from Santa on Dec 19.
- Presidio Theatre presents the Bay Area's new must-see holiday tradition, Panto in the Presidio (November 29–December 28). This year's show, Peter Pan, returns by popular demand, packed with laughter, music, and audience participation for all ages.
- The Presidio Officers' Club Gallery (open Friday—Sunday, 11 a.m.–4 p.m.) invites visitors to explore the Presidio's fascinating military and cultural history, free of charge.
- The <u>Presidio Visitor Center</u> (open every day from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.) also offers interpretive displays and helpful staff to help you find the right park adventure.

The Presidio is one of America's most visited national park sites, located within the Golden Gate National Recreation Area. Spanning 1,500 acres next to San Francisco's Golden Gate Bridge, the Presidio is among the most biologically diverse parks in America. Historically a home to native peoples and a military post under three flags, its facilities have been reinvented as museums, restaurants, hotels, homes, and offices. The Presidio Trust is the federal agency that stewards the Presidio, in partnership with the National Park Service and with support from the Golden Gate National Parks Conservancy.
